**The Men of Cajamarca** Jul 19 2021 In November 1532, a group of 168 Spaniards seized the Inca emperor Atahualpa in the town of Cajamarca, in the northern Peruvian highlands. Their act, quickly taken as a symbol of the conquest of a vast empire, brought them unprecedented rewards in gold and silver; it made them celebrities, gave them first choice of positions of honor and power in the new Peru of the Spaniards, and opened up the possibility of a splendid life at home in Spain, if they so desired. The author traces the lives of the men to their beginnings in Spain and follows their careers after the episode in Cajamarca.
