Always cover yourself by making copies of your contract, move-in checklist, any checks or money orders, handwritten work orders, complaints against other residents and, most of all, your Notice to Vacate. Make sure you get a time, date and signature of the leasing agent of everything you give them. Do not assume the items you give them will make it into your files with them. Things do get misplaced; to error is human. Do not think you are above the rules of the Community. This could cost you a non-renewal or eviction. 7 years is a long time before qualifying for another apartment. Always do a walk-through checklist when you move in an apartment. Always do a walk-through with your management team when moving out.
