The poems of this period show the extent both of Shelley's engagement with Keats's volume *Lamia, Isabella, The Eve of St. Agnes, and Other Poems* (1820) — a copy of which he first read in October 1820 — and of his interest in Italian history, culture and politics. Shelley's translations of some of his own

poems into Italian and his original compositions in the language are also included here. In addition to accompanying commentaries, there are extensive bibliographies to the poems, a chronological table of Shelley's life and publications, and indexes to titles and first lines. The volumes of *The Poems of Shelley* form the most comprehensive edition of Shelley's poetry available to students and scholars.

The result is both stirring biography and a bold reconsideration of how the Renaissance understood science and art—and of what was lost when that understanding was forgotten.
